## **ARE WE A SIGNAL COMMUNITY?**

**At the 2008 Peace Colloquy  
of our church October 3 -5  
there will be reports on  
communities characterized  
by the spirit of peace and  
friendship. These have been  
called "signal communities."**

**What is a signal  
community?" Andrew  
Bolton who is the Colloquy  
organizer says "It is a  
voluntary group of people  
who in their life together  
witness of the kingdom of  
God on earth and commit to  
share Christ's full peace in  
the world. This may be for a  
short time or for life. These  
groups may be house –or  
congregation- or village-  
sized. Together they are  
signal points to the future  
God desires for all of  
creation. Typically they are  
part of a larger social  
movement working for  
change in the world.**
